Battle of Huck's Defeat

Historic Brattonsville-McConnells, SC

Saturday, July 9, 2016

Your South Carolina Society of the Sons of the Revolution President Chuck Swoope attended the annual wreath laying ceremony. Also attending (photo) is the South Carolina Society of the Sons of the American Revolution President Wayne Cousar. It was an historic moment for the two presidents of each state fraternal and patriotic revolutionary war societies to meet in this Upper State region at "Huck's Defeat".

The local historic sign describes how James Williamson settled on Fishing Creek in 1766 and built a log house. On July 12, 1780 an approximate number of 120 British and Loyalist troops led by Captain Christian Huck camped at the Williamson home. They were attacked and defeated by 140 local Patriot Militiamen led by Col. William Bratton and other officers in the Battle of Williamson's Plantation or Huck's Defeat.
