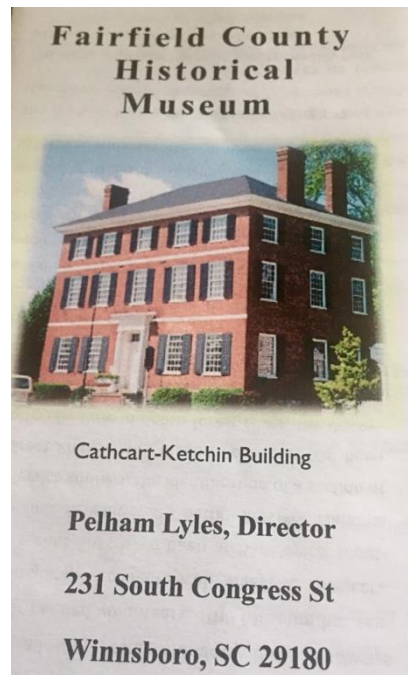


1776 Cornwallis House
